

# Charity night to net cash for trek

A charity night to raise money for Wolverhampton's Compton Hospice will be held in The Slide Rooms in April next year, it has been announced.

On July 30, Louise Wilson from Stafford is set to climb Mount Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest mountain, in aid of Compton Hospice. In order to raise money for the Mount Kilimanjaro Challenge, she has got together with Wolverhampton Civic Hall to put on a pop-up themed concert which is a genre close to her heart.

This will be held at the Civic Hall's new venue on Broad Street, The Slide Rooms on April 30, 2011, and doors open at 6pm.

The show will consist of local bands such as headlineers Sunset on Suburbs and From the Get Go, with support from All Thought Out from Dudley and Stafford's own Platypus Duck and Diamonds & Dynamite.

# Holocaust survivors are portrayed in moving exhibition Pictures tell story of wartime horrors

An exhibition about Holocaust survivors has opened in Lichfield. Portraits for Posterity is being staged at three different venues in and near the city.

Magda Bloom, an 80-year-old survivor from Birmingham, yesterday helped launch the photographic exhibition and spoke about her experiences at the Lichfield Campus of South Staffordshire College and at the National Memorial Arboretum at Alrewas.

Hungarian-born Mrs Bloom survived both Auschwitz-Birkenau and Belsen but lost her entire family in the Second World War Nazi concentration camps. As well as displays at the Wedge Gallery at the Lichfield campus and the National Memorial Arboretum, more photographs are on show in Lichfield Cathedral until November 14.

### Debut

Portraits for Posterity features studies by photographer Matt Writtle of survivors who made a new life in Britain. His portraits are accompanied by a short biography drawn from the sitter's own words.

Portraits for Posterity made its debut in London in January last year after which it was decided to include Holocaust survivors living in other areas of the country.

It is dedicated to educating both young and old about the Holocaust which claimed the lives of at least six million Jews and a

million Jewish children. The exhibition was formally opened by Graham Mackley, chief executive and principal of South Staffordshire College.

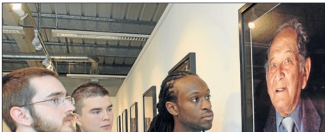
Matt Writtle, who used to work for the Shropshire Star and Express & Star, has been based in London since 2003. He has also worked in Australia and Hong Kong and for several national newspapers.

He was named young photographer of the year at the Beata's Midlands Photography Awards in 1997.

# Tribute plaque on way at club

The son of a man who founded a Black Country boxing club has raised the cash needed to buy a memorial plaque to his father following a charity event.

Eric's impromptu son Joe Wood Jr, aged 44, of Roseville Street, Walsall, sang at the event in Pleck Working Men's Club, Scarborough Road on Saturday. He raised funds for Cancer Research UK and a memorial plaque for his father Joe Wood.

Father-of-three Mr Wood, of Jerome Road, Walsall, a self-employed road building worker, died of cancer in 2002, aged 68. He won 30 of 32 fights as a professional boxer and formed Pleck Amateur Boxing Club.

After forming the club more than 30 years ago he coached for about 20 years. Singer Dewi Cullum, local band Reform and DJ Lee Knowles also gave up their time for the cause.

The night raised £602, which will be split between the charity and a plaque at Pleck Working Men's Club, where Mr Wood was a regular customer.

Wood Jr, a former amateur boxer, said: "It went very well."
